VEHOA RULES

General Rules

- Each member of the HOA must make themselves aware and understand the rules of the pool. It is the lifeguard's job to enforce these rules regardless of if the swimmers know them or not.
- A landlord who gives tenants the use of the pool forfeits their privileges of use.
- All persons who use the pool do so at their own risk. The HOA will not be responsible for any accident or injury in connection with the use.
- The transfer or loaning of pool tags is not permitted. Failure to comply will result in privileges being revoked.
- HOA officers must provide impartial enforcement of the pool rules and exact penalties for their violation. Matter specifically related to the pool should be handled by the pool manager.

Late night swims will be determined by the head lifeguard and the pool manager for Fridays of every month. They can be every Friday or every other Friday. For Late night swim, the pool will stay open until 10:00 p.m.

Swimming Pool Rules

These are made and enforced by the HOA and Lifeguards for the safety of all swimmers, for the protection of all swimmer's rights and for the health of all swimmers in the pool.

1. DO NOT Distract the lifeguards. If you need to talk to them, wait until a rest break or until they are off duty.
2. Everyone MUST sign in every time they enter the pool. The sign in sheet is located at the window of the guard office. Members must also sign guests in.
3. The following are prohibited in the pool area:
 - a. Climbing or sitting in the guard chairs.
 - b. Running or rough play.
 - c. Profane language and derogatory remarks.
 - d. Glass containers.
 - e. Animals or pets.
 - f. Food, Drink, Candy in the water.
 - g. Riding on Bikes, Rollerblades, Scooters, or Skateboards.
 - h. Sitting or playing on pool cover.
 - i. Diving in shallow end of pool.
 - j. Climbing on fence or pool furniture.
 - k. Dunking or throwing people in (under guard discretion).
 - l. Smoking.
 - m. Any Alcoholic Beverages.
4. Members MUST show a **current** pool tag to the lifeguard on duty every time they enter the pool area. Without a current tag, they will not be allowed into the pool area.
5. All guests must have an HOA member with them at all times. It is the responsibility of the member to educate the guest on all pool rules and abide by them. Having a guest at the pool is a privilege, if abused, then the member and the guest will have privileges revoked. (Guests cannot bring guests).
6. Children 10 years old and younger must be accompanied by an adult at all times. In addition, any minor ages 10-17 must pass a swim test and have a current signed emergency contact form filled out, and signed by a parent and a lifeguard. If problems arise with the child, a lifeguard or pool manager can request the child be accompanied by an adult from the household.
7. If the child requires adult supervision (i.e. they are younger than 10 or have not passed their swim test) an adult must be present inside the pool area and vigilant of their child.
8. There will be rest breaks every hour, the pool must be cleared by swimmers under the age of 18 years old.
9. Obey the parking signs and be aware of crosswalks.
10. Only swim diapers are allowed in the pool.
11. **SILDE: person must be 48" tall, be able to swim in the 9 feet area, and do not require a parent or floatation devices to go down. Only one individual allowed at a time, feet first. Keep the area below the slide clear of swimmers.**

Baby Pool Rules

1. Pool use is for children 7 years old and younger and those unable to swim in main pool.
2. All children using baby pool must be supervised by a parent or an adult at all times.
3. Those supervising the children are responsible at all times, this means for accidents and cleaning up.

Swimming Lessons

1. Each summer we will try and provide swimming lessons for residents throughout the summer if interest is shown. See a lifeguard for more information.
2. The fee provided by the lifeguards must be paid in full before the child can begin lessons.

Pool Parties

Pool parties must be scheduled with a lifeguard or pool manager.

1. The member must be a member of the VEHOA in good standing with no outstanding liabilities owed to VEHOA
 2. The Member **MUST BE PRESENT** at the party from beginning to end
 3. The rental fee for the pool is \$10.00 for security deposit and \$30.00 per lifeguard
 - a. \$40.00 (1-25 guests)
 - b. \$70.00 (26-50 guests)
 - c. \$100.00 (51-75 guests)
- Guests are considered all people inside gate, not just swimmers**
4. Upon the execution of this agreement the Member tenders to VEHOA the rental security deposit of \$10.00 in which no additional security fee is required. Security deposit can be check or cash. The fee for the lifeguards **MUST** be paid in cash **which is payable at the beginning of the pool party.**
 5. The member shall be responsible to clean up in and around the pool area at the end of the party.
 6. The Member can cancel the party **AT LEAST** 48 hours in advance of the scheduled date. VEHOA will refund the security deposit to the member.
 7. If inclement weather persists, an attempt will be made to reschedule party. If a date cannot be agreed upon, a refund will be issued to the member.
 8. The Member acknowledges that they use the pool at their own risk and is responsible for the conduct and safety of their guests. All House Rules of the pool are to be followed and the Member agrees to said House Rules. If the House Rules are not followed, the party will be asked to leave without a refund.
 9. When school is in session, parties are only to be allowed on weekends.
 10. **PARTIES ARE PROHIBITED ON LATE NIGHT SWIMS.**

Weather

The pool will remain open unless the following conditions exist:

1. Lightning is sighted
2. Thunder is audible
3. Temperature is below 65 degrees. (This is considered *Inclement Weather*).
4. Excessive wind or hail, or anything that decreases visibility and overall safety of others.

Lightning & Thunder

- Once lightning is seen or thunder is heard, the lifeguard on duty needs to clear the swimmers from the pool. No one shall be sitting next to the pool or have their feet in.
- Thunder break should be 30 minutes. Restart thunder break every time lightning is spotted or thunder is heard

Storms

- If the weather is forecasted to improve, the lifeguard can remain on duty. If the forecast shows otherwise, they may be asked to leave and remain on call to return to their shift if the weather clears.

Inclement Weather

- In the event that the pool needs to close, the lifeguard on duty will need to put up the "Pool Closed due to Inclement Weather" sign on the fence and complete the closing tasks as best as possible.
- The guard on duty needs to notify the pool manager or head lifeguard if the pool is being shut down due to weather conditions. They also need to notify the guard scheduled next.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

Swimmers

Violation 1: Warning

Violation 2: Swimmer and party are sent home for the remainder of the day. They can appeal to the Head Lifeguard. If the child is under 18 years old, they must have a parent accompany them while talking to the Head Lifeguard.

Violation 3: Swimmer and party are sent home and not allowed to come back for the remainder of the week.

Violation 4: Swimmer and party are sent home and not allowed to come back for the remainder of the summer.
